



## *Is your loved one with ALZHEIMER'S often Agitated or Aggressive?*

Find out if he or she may qualify for the SERENE study.

The SERENE clinical research study is looking for people with Alzheimer's disease who have agitated and aggressive behavior. Doctors want to learn if an investigational medication may be an option for treating this symptom of Alzheimer's. ("Investigational" means this drug isn't approved for use by the general public for this indication.)

If you volunteer and qualify for this study, your loved one will receive study medication for up to 12 weeks. During the study they will be asked to make regular visits to the clinic. His or her health is very important to us, and will be monitored throughout the study.

**Talk to your doctor or nurse about the SERENE study.**

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Your loved one may qualify to participate if he/she is:

- Age 50 or older
- Diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease
- Showing agitated and aggressive behavior

Qualified volunteers will receive:

- No-cost study medication for agitation/aggression in patients with Alzheimer's disease
- No-cost study-related medical care
- Reimbursement for time and travel
